## March 2017 Monthly Catalogue

Welcome to the March 2017 edition of the NHBS Monthly Catalogue, which lists all new titles added to our website in the last month. We have been hard at work to give the monthly catalogue a facelift, which is why this edition is being sent out a little bit later than usual. At the top of this editorial you will find a link to a webpage listing all titles as before. For those who prefer to print the monthly catalogue, a link to the PDF version is also given above.

Cambridge University Press has announced two important titles on applied conservation science: Genetic Management of Fragmented Animal and Plant Populations (due June), and Plant Conservation Science and Practice: The Role of Botanic Gardens (due July). The former looks set to be one of the first books to deal with this aspect of population fragmentation. How valuable scientific contributions by citizens can be will be highlighted in

Citizen Science: How Ordinary People are Changing the Face of Discovery (due October). Allen Lane has announced a potentially controversial title, written by distinguished ecologist Chris D. Thomas, due July: Inheritors of the Earth: How Nature is Thriving in an Age of Extinction. In it, Thomas argues that the dominant narrative of the ongoing sixth mass extinction obscures the fact that we are seeing the first stages of a new mass acceleration of ecological and evolutionary diversity. We are keenly looking forward to a review copy of this book and will report on it in the coming months.

Botanists will be pleased to hear a new BSBI Handbook, <u>Violas of Britain and Ireland</u>, should be available this month. Furthermore, Cambridge University Press has announced the fourth edition of its incredibly popular dictionary, <u>Mabberley's Plant-Book</u>, for June 2017. <u>The New Flora of the Isles of Scilly</u> will be published in March, and is the first account for this area since 1971.

Birders can look forward to the 7th edition of the National Geographic Field Guide to the Birds of North America, due September, several new bilingual birding maps from BioGea Edicions, whose range we now stock, and an academic text on Avian Cognition from Cambridge University Press, due May.

Those with an interest in invertebrates should take a look at CSIRO's <u>A Field Guide to Spiders of Australia</u>, due June, and a large tome from ConchBooks on <u>Marine and Freshwater Amphipoda from the Baltic Sea and Adjacent Territories</u>, which is a part of the long-running series Die Tierwelt Deutschlands. For entomologists at home we have uncovered another butterfly guide, <u>Butterfly Walks in Gloucestershire</u>.

There are some excellent books on marine wildlife coming as well. Johns Hopkins announced <u>Beaked Whales: A Complete Guide to Their Biology and Conservation</u> for May, which will feature illustrations by Richard Ellis. Colin Speedie's book <u>A Sea Monster's Tale</u>, now in stock, walks us through the history of the exploitation of the basking shark, and is one of the few books on this shark species. Whale watchers can delight in a second guide from Bloomsbury by the hand of Mark Carwardine, due August, this one focusing on North America.

Those looking at art or photography books should take a look at <u>The Camargue</u>, which would make a perfect gift, <u>Garamba: Conservation in Peace & War</u>, which tells the success story of Northern White Rhino conservation in the Democratic Republic of Congo, <u>Way of the Wolf: The Paintings of Pollyanna Pickering</u>, or, one title I am personally very excited about, Taschen's <u>Paleoart: Visions of the Prehistoric Past</u>, 1830-1980, due June.

Finally, several important titles have been announced as paperback reprints: Stephen Moss's <u>Wild Kingdom: Bringing Back Britain's Wildlife</u> (April), Frans de Waal's <u>Are We Smart Enough to Know How Smart Animals Are?</u> (April), Jennifer Ackerman's <u>The Genius of Birds</u> (May) and the Coppinger's exploration of feral dogs: What Is a Dog? (April)
