December 2018 Monthly Catalogue

Welcome to the December 2018 edition of the NHBS Monthly Catalogue, which lists all new titles added to our website in the last month.

For those birdwatchers making plans for next year, there are three field or site guides to keep an eye out for: Bloomsbury is publishing a 3rd edition of <u>Birds of Trinidad and Tobago</u> in March, Lynx is publishing <u>Birds of Vietnam</u> in December, and we just received stock of <u>Birding Estonia</u>. Also of interest, though not exclusively focused on a birdwatching audience, is the <u>Crossbill Guide: Provence and Camargue, France</u>, due May. Other titles of interest are the paperbacks of New Holland's <u>Owls of the World</u>, available now, and Bloomsbury's <u>Mrs Moreau's Warbler: How Birds Got Their Names</u>, due April. Pelagic Publishing has announced The Red Kite's Year for April, and Bloomsbury will publish RSPB Spotlight: Osprey in May.

For other animal groups there are not as many books to announce, though we have one important title coming into stock very soon: <u>A Review of the Population and Conservation Status of British Mammals</u>, a 700-page report published by the Mammal Society that provides the first such comprehensive review in over two decades. Then there are paperbacks of Chelsea Green's <u>Eager: The Surprising</u>, <u>Secret Life of Beavers and Why They Matter</u> in April, and Bloomsbury's <u>Eye of the Shoal: A Fish-Watcher's Guide to Life</u>, the Ocean and Everything in May.

For entomologists and invertebrate workers we have the second edition of <u>Butterflies of Britain and Europe: A Photographic Guide</u> in March coming from Bloomsbury, the second edition of <u>Nudibranch & Sea Slug Identification: Indo-Pacific</u>, out now from New World Publications, and the French book
Les Crustacés Décapodes des Petites Antilles: Avec de Nouvelles Observations pour Saint-Martin, la Guadeloupe et la Martinique due in December from the Muséum
National d'Histoire Naturelle in Paris.

Botanists can rejoice in some outstanding field guides. John Poland, who wrote the very popular Vegetative Key, is about to release Field Key to Winter Twigs: A Guide to Native and Planted Deciduous Trees, Shrubs and Woody Climbers (Xylophytes) found in the British Isles, and we have stock of the Illustrated Field Guide to the Flora of Georgia (South Caucasus) from the Universität Koblenz-Landau, and of the privately published Orchids of the Maltese Islands: A Descriptive Guide. NatureBureau will publish Cambridgeshire's Mosses & Liverworts: A Dynamic Flora in March. Two books on plant biology are How Plants Work: Form, Diversity, Survival, out now from The Ivy Press, and Making Eden: How Plants Transformed a Barren Planet, due February from Oxford University Press. A nice book for leisure reading is Bloomsbury's Orchid Summer: In Search of the Wildest Flowers of the British Isles due in paperback in May.

For biologists, and ecologists in particular, this month we can offer <u>The Ecology of Hedgerows and Field Margins</u>, due February from Routledge, and <u>Invasive Aliens</u>: <u>Plants and Animals from Over There That Are Over Here</u>, due May from Harper Collins. Furthermore, the paperback of <u>The Art of Naming</u> from MIT Press is due in April, and Sinauer has published the 11th edition of their textbook <u>Animal Behavior</u>: <u>An Evolutionary Approach</u>.

On the topic of conservation and environmental issues <u>Biodiversity of Angola: Science & Conservation: A Modern Synthesis</u>, due January from Springer, and the paperback of Bloomsbury's <u>The Bumblebee Flies Anyway: A Year of Gardening and (Wild)Life</u> in May. Faber & Faber will publish the paperback of <u>Confessions of a Recovering Environmentalist</u> in May, while Allen Lane will publish <u>The Uninhabitable Earth: What Climate Change Means</u> in April. This book has gotten quite a bit of advance press because the author, David Wallace-Wells, published a <u>long-read in New York Magazine</u> in advance of this book. Lastly, another very interesting book is <u>The Omega Principle: Seafood and the Quest for a Long Life and a Healthier Planet</u>, which is out now from Penguin.

To finish, a smattering of books more aimed at leisure reading are the 25th anniversary edition of E.O. Wilson's book <u>Naturalist</u>, due May from Island Press, and Barry Lopez's new book <u>Horizon</u>, due March from Bodley Head. Two titles of local interest, both out now, are Naturebureau's <u>Shotover: The Life of an Oxfordshire Hill</u>, and <u>What's in a West Berkshire Wood? And How Did it Get There?</u>, published by the West Berkshire Countryside Society. Finally, two noteworthy environmental history titles from the University of Chicago Press are the paperback of <u>Under Osman's Tree: The Ottoman Empire, Egypt & Environmental History</u>, due March, and <u>Wild Sea: A History of the Southern Ocean</u>, due April. The latter is a reannouncement. It was originally published in Australia, but will be published in Europe later next year.
