October 2025 Monthly Catalogue

Welcome to the October 2025 edition of the NHBS Monthly Catalogue, which lists all new titles added to our website in the last month.

Starting with the vertebrates, Vincent Wildlife Trust has just published the second edition of The Lesser Horseshoe Bat Conservation Handbook, while the Wildlife Conservation Society in Sri Lanka has published Land Mammals of Sri Lanka: A Field Companion, which, as the title implies, is a portable companion to the author's book The Mammals of Sri Lanka that was published in 2013. For birdwatchers, we have Where to Watch Birds in Northwest England: Lancashire, Cheshire, Merseyside and Greater Manchester, due in February from Helm, while ornithologists will want to check out Migrating and Wintering Waterfowl, due in March from CRC Press. For those interested in sharks or diving, there is

The Shark Watcher's Manual: A Guide to Species and Where to Find Them, due in March from Princeton University

We have a strong list of entomology books this month, notably Insects of Britain and Europe: A Field Guide, which will be published in February by WILDGuides. Three butterfly books topped the list this month:

Field Guide to the Butterflies of Wales, due in March from Pelagic Publishing; the paperback of Butterfly Biology Systems: Connections and Interactions in Life History and Behaviour, due in December from CABI; and Colin Smith 'Putali Baje' (Butterfly Grandad): One Million Footsteps in Nepal, which is due this month and is a privately published short memoir about this remarkable lepidopterologist. Natural History Publications Borneo has just released A Photographic Guide: Stick Insects of Borneo, while the paperback of Conservation of Dragonflies: Sentinels for Freshwater Conservation is due in December from CABI. Finally, the Field Studies Council has announced that it will take on the publication of Andrew Duff's series Beetles of Britain and Ireland. Though the series is complete in four volumes, some volumes have sold out.

Beetles of Britain and Ireland, Volume 1: Sphaeriusidae to Silphidae will be reissued in November with minor amendments.

For freshwater biologists, we have two noteworthy books. <u>Crayfish of the World: A Comprehensive Guide</u> was published recently by Fish Magazine Taiwan, while Johns Hopkins University Press will release The Functional Ecology of Freshwater Mussels in March.

We have a sizable list of botanical titles, most of a rather technical nature. Several recent releases are Orchid Species of the World: 3,333 Species from 343 Genera Described and Illustrated from New Holland Publishers, Melastoma in Peninsular Malaysia and Singapore: Taxonomy, Biology, and Uses from Natural History Publications Borneo, and Red Sea Seaweeds: A Field Guide to the Seaweeds and Sea Grasses of the Red Sea from Koeltz Botanical Books. Other titles continue ongoing series. SANBI Publishing has released Flowering Plants of Africa, Volume 69: Plates 2401–2420, Koeltz Botanical Books has published Materials to the Orchid Flora of Colombia, Volume 4: Epidendroideae, Part 1, and Springer will publish World Atlas of Freshwater Macrophytes, Volume 3: Monocotyledonous Species I (Acoraceae - Cyperaceae) in December.

On the subject of conservation and other environmental issues, there are four notable books.

Ancient: Reviving the Woods That Made Britain is due in March from Profile Books, while Sort of Books will publish The Cow in the Room (And Why We Shouldn't Eat It) in January. Two paperback reissues scheduled for March are Partha Dasgupta's On Natural Capital: The Value of the World Around Us from Witness Books, and Tony Juniper's Just Earth: How a Fairer World Will Save the Planet from Bloomsbury Continuum.

A final miscellany of books covers a range of subjects. Princeton University Press is reissuing two titles in paperback that will be of interest to readers of environmental history

(The Last of Its Kind: The Search for the Great Auk and the Discovery of Extinction is due in March) and animal behaviour and cognition (Playing Possum: How Animals Understand Death is due in April). Two habitat-related books are Lechuguilla Cave: Discoveries in a Hidden Splendor, published by Speleo-Photo Editions, and

Press.

Habitats of Australia, New Guinea, and the Solomons: A Field Guide for Birders, Naturalists, and Ecologists, due in March from Princeton University Press. Lastly, on the topic of nature writing, we have Love Is a Toad: Exploring Our Relationship With the Wild, due in March from Blink Publishing.
